Autumn 2025 Highlights

- GRAMMY-winning jazz pianist <u>Sullivan Fortner</u> opens the season by blending his New Orleans jazz roots with the cosmic chaos and kinetic rhythms of **Sun Ra**.
- A wind octet of musicians from the fan favorite <u>Chicago Symphony Orchestra</u> explores themes of musical adaptation in a dramatic program featuring selections from *Don Giovanni* and *The Magic Flute*, Prokofiev's Suite from *Romeo and Juliet*, and Mozart's stormy Serenade for Winds.
- The passionate and precise <u>Belcea Quartet</u> play Beethoven's bittersweet, final string quartet, Mozart's unusual "Dissonance Quartet," and two short pieces by Mendelssohn.

- Ukrainian musical project <u>Kurbasy</u> channels Ukrainian folklore through tight vocal harmonies, spectral instrumentation, and striking visual storytelling in a performance of their latest work, Songs of the Ukrainian Forest.
- Contemporary chamber orchestra <u>Alarm Will Sound</u> returns to UChicago's Logan Center to record and perform two works by UChicago Professor of Composition **Hans Thomalla**.
- The Gramophone Award-winning ensemble <u>Cappella Pratensis</u>, one of the world's only ensembles to sing directly from historical notation, brings Guillaume Dufay's sumptuous *Missa Ecce ancilla Domini* to life.
- In a co-presentation with The Renaissance Society, UChicago Presents hosts the **Chicago** premiere of **Pulitzer Prize-winner** Raven Chacon's American Ledger No. 3—a free public performance for women's choir honoring the legacy of Chicago activist **Ida B. Wells.**
- The legendary <u>Brentano String Quartet</u> delivers a tour-de-force evening of string quartet mastery, with their UChicago program featuring Haydn at his most playful, Bartók at his most bracing, and Dvořák in full lyric flight.
- <u>The Grossman Ensemble</u> adds four new works to its already impressive roster of 75 world premieres, debuting compositions by composers Kay Rhie, Ryan Chase, Mikel Kuehn, and Inés Thiebaut.

CHICAGO – University of Chicago Presents (UCP), the University of Chicago's premier performing arts series, debuts its 82nd season with nine concerts in the Autumn 2025 quarter. A cultural cornerstone on campus and across the city, UChicago Presents continues to unite world-class artists with the vibrant Chicago community.

UChicago Presents embraces the spirit of inquiry that defines the University and the multidisciplinary arts scene in the city of Chicago. This autumn's concerts bring musicians from around the world—such as the sonically colorful and visually stunning Ukrainian group **Kurbasy** and the Netherlands-based Renaissance vocal masters **Cappella Pratensis**—and celebrates local legends, including **Sullivan Fortner**'s tribute to **Sun Ra** and **Raven Chacon**'s work for choir honoring the legacy of **Ida B. Wells.** Performances are held on the University of Chicago campus, featuring two iconic venues: the Reva and David Logan Center for the Arts and Mandel Hall, with genres spanning classical, jazz, new music, early music, and world music.

The programs presented on UCP's stages this autumn invite concert goers to explore new musical territories and engage in shared discovery.
